# Current State of Local Development

  - How is the local production to be transformed into a key concept within the current market?
  - What the local development history can teach us?
  - How sufficient the local development policies are, and how they affect the situation when the local actors come into play?
  - Finally, can innovative entrepreneurs make the local production system compete with the major companies within the global markets?





- Institutional development, cooperation amongst the local actors, • entrepreneurship and innovation seem to be the key factors of a competitive and well-running local production system.
- As a part of this research, the possible entrepreneurship strategies as ulletwell as the highly cost-effective and alternative opportunities for local development are to be investigated.
- Utilizing local resources in an innovative way may be the anticipated answer. •
- Mutually integrating the local actors and skillful entrepreneurs into the • production system not only provides a more efficient usage of resources such as land, labor, equipment and time, but it would also yield marvelous results.

- Although developing a region is seen as a duty of the local administration, and ulletalthough this development process is maintained by using funds coming from the central government, it could sometimes be tough for a local administration to get by with only the funds provided by the central government, especially in less developed countries.
- If the funds provided by the central government are insufficient to fully develop ulleta region, instead of wasting these low funds, they could be used to create an environment in order to attract some skillful entrepreneurs.
- Once the entrepreneurs arrive and initiate the investments, the region would start to develop and become a ripe environment for both local actors and entrepreneurs.
- Consequently, this might be a suitable way for underdeveloped or developing lacksquarecountries to build up regions when the hopes are high and funds are low.

- Although supporting entrepreneurs and local actors is crucial to develop rural areas, it is not enough by itself.
- Local development comprises much more detailed steps. ullet
- If the development ideas come from a single perspective only, • everything will be led into a void.
  - For example, think of a place where there are many hotels, restaurants, souvenir shops and historical buildings attracting lots of tourists with a poor infrastructure... (e.g., poor public transport system, water supply, waste treatment, telecommunication systems, etc.)
  - Such imbalanced areas are not only a waste of funds, but they also create a notoriety for the whole region.

Regular and constant evolution of the strategy cannot be emphasized enough. Although it usually disregarded by local actors, EU LEDA program offers a three step solution for this:

The foundation stage of "acquiring the know-how" of local development normally occupies five or more years.

Efforts should focus on a small number of flagship projects and on public awareness-raising.

The second stage, "using the know-how" takes place usually between the fifth and tenth years of the local development process. During this stage, the established core of people, institutions and infrastructure mean that projects are initiated spontaneously, evaluation and targeting are improved and there is more innovation, exporting and inter-firm cooperation.

If conditions are right, the area may then move into the stage of "self-sustaining development".

Continued action should then concentrate on filling gaps in service provision, improving SME finance & exploring new opportunities.
